EXISTING CONDITIONS TODAY

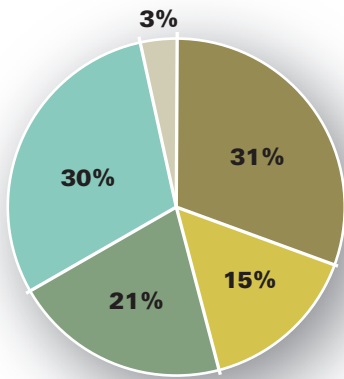
- UC Santa Cruz has roughly the same number of vehicle trips to and from campus as it did 20 years ago.
- Since 2005, weekday traffic to campus has declined by 2,151 vehicle trips per day.
- UC Santa Cruz is perched on a hill, which makes access difficult. The campus is committed to reducing single-occupancy car trips and encouraging bicycling, transit, and walking options.
- Campus shuttles transport 12,000 people each school day.
- Campus students, faculty, and staff make up approximately 50% of the county's metro ridership.
- UC Santa Cruz was named a 2014 Silver Bicycle Friendly campus by the League of American Bicyclists, despite its challenging terrain (the rise in elevation from downtown to the central campus is a daunting 600 feet).
- In the last 25 years, single-occupant vehicle travel has decreased from 45% to 30%.

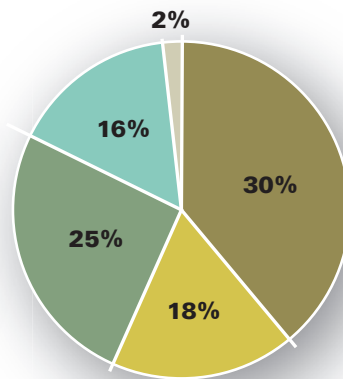


**Mode Share** Mode shares vary by commuter type. Results based on self-reported campus surveys.

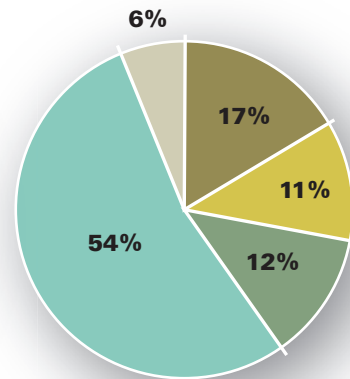
